## Judaism in the First Century

Hellenized to varying extents in all its forms Varying "denominations" of 1<sup>st</sup> century Judaism

🌣 Phárisees, a lay movement emphasizing purity and

adherence to the Oral Torah

Sadducees, Temple-oriented group emphasizing observance of Torah as written, cordial to Rome Dead Sea, a radical purity group emphasizing

purified ideal Temple; separatists, Essenes (?) Rebels, an armed response to Roman occupation,

theologically thin; "no king but God"

Samaritans, keeping ancient form of Torah observance, with own Temple

Ordinary people non-partisan, semi-observant Christians Gentile-inclusive, complex relations to

Torah and Temple; comparable to Pharisees

Destruction of Temple in 70 CE catalyzed change to a faith oriented toward prayer and way-of-life
